Energy efficiency is a commercial success factor. Not only is it the most direct way to cut energy and consequently costs, but consuming less energy also mitigates climate change and preserves the environment. Energy efficient small & medium enterprises (SMEs) play a vital role in achieving the goals of the EU's Energy Union Strategy and in reaching the EU's 2020 and 2030 energy and climate targets. SMEs are also significant producers and consumers of renewable energy. However, in order to boost SMEs' intelligent energy use, they need guidance and support.

STEEEP is a 3-year project that has helped 600 SMEs in 10 European countries to implement energy management strategies to become more energy efficient. A policy debate will follow after hearing from entrepreneurs who have taken part in STEEEP.
